Diane Clements Japanese Embroider Scholarship Fund

The Evergreen Chapter JE Special Interest Group has discussed the scholarship and the criteria we would like around administering the scholarship are as follows:

- The applicant must be a GPR member.
- There will be 4 scholarships of \$350. We would like to see this be an annual scholarship for 4 years.
- Each scholarship is eligible for classes in either Japanese Embroidery or Japanese Beading.
- The first scholarship winner that is a beginning Japanese Embroidery student will receive a kit of "Bouquet from the Heart of Japan". Including the necessary silk threads and a frame. The frame was donated by Mary Alice Sinton of Blue Bonnet Studios. If there are no beginner scholarship applicants, the kit and frame will be donated to GPR to auctioned or sold.
- If the scholarship student is a beginner they would need to purchase any additional beginner supplies.
- Previous Japanese Embroidery students (not beginners) receive a cash scholarship....no kit/frame.
- The application should describe the applicants' goals in studying Japanese Embroidery and why they want to study Japanese Embroidery.
- Previous scholarship recipients are not eligible.
- The scholarship may be applied to any JE class whether sponsored by EGA or not. The class does not need to be taught within the GPR region.
- The teacher must be JEC certified and/or completed Traditional Japanese Embroidery apprenticeship in Japan.
